"Estrogen Signaling and Polyphenol Bioactivation in Bone: Leveraging Tissue- specific Pathways for Healthy Aging and Breast Cancer Metastasis Prevention"

Dr. Funk is a Professor of Medicine at the University of Arizona whose laboratory investigates bone-specific pathways with the goal of identifying and developing new therapeutic approaches to promote skeletal health.

Dr. Funk earned a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry from Stanford University, a Master of Science in Biophysical Chemistry from Cornell University, and a Doctor of Medicine from the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF). She subsequently completed her clinical training in endocrinology, diabetes, and metabolism, as well as a research fellowship focused on lipids and innate immunity at UCSF. Following her training, she joined the faculty at the University of Arizona, where she has collaborated closely with numerous colleagues in the Physiological Sciences Graduate Interdisciplinary Program.
